Exam in 4507 Ecotourism: theories and concepts, spring 2010

The exam contains four parts. It is noted how much each part counts compared to the totality.

Part I (counts 30%):

Part II (counts 20%):

What is meant by “the complexity of the ecotourism product” and what is meant by “the ecotourism industry”? Give examples.

Part III (counts 30%):

What are the differences between anthropocentric and non-anthropocentric environmental ethics. Provide examples of philosophers representing each of these ethics. Account for the following:

- How does the animal care perspective of Peter Singer differ from that of Tom Regan?

Part IV (counts 20%):

Describe the six stages of Butler’s lifecycle and explain the relation between these stages.
