 - c. /t, w, b, p, m/
 - d. /I, A, æ, i:, e/
 - e. /ʃ, tʃ, 3, z, ʤ/
- 2. Provide a <u>phonemic transcription</u> of the following passage (adapted from J. Tey *The Daughter of Time*), and then <u>answer</u> the subsequent questions. Remember to use weak forms where applicable. As a source of help, the symbol 'indicates stressed words. You do not need to mark stress in your transcription, but you must mark potential pauses using the sign |. Specify whether you are transcribing <u>RP</u> or <u>AE</u>.
 - "'What do you 'know about 'Richard the 'Third?" asked 'Grant.
 - "'Is there a 'prize?" 'replied the 'porter.
 - "What 'for?"
 - "The 'quiz."
 - "No, 'just the 'satisfaction of 'intellectual 'curiosity. 'So, 'what was 'Richard 'III 'like?"
