Style might be an integral part of good writing. Rather than a discreet element. You create a Piece of Writing that accomplishes all you set out to accomplish, includes no word that stray from your purpose, and is internally consequent and graceful without excess, then you achieved style. Notice I said create a piece of writing. The reason is because writing good with style rarely just happens it has to be worked at, crafted, rewritten, revised, and rearranged. Marble sculptures are beautiful to look at, completely finished, and gracefully serves the purpose of portraying a subject. Your writing should go through a similar process of close revision until the final product is also beautiful to look at, completely revised, and serves it's purpose.
