PART 1 (60%)

Please answer two of the following four questions (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ – 2 pages on each):

- 1. Give an outline of how English has become a global language. Your answer should take into account developments from Early Modern English and onwards.
- 2. What are the main reasons behind the current differences between British English and American English? Your discussion should include historical and political circumstances. Illustrate with some linguistic examples.
- 3. Account for the standardisation process in English in late Middle English (from around 1350) and Early Modern English.

PART 2 (40%)

Please answer three of the following four questions (1/2 - 1) page on each:

- 1. What are typical features of **Estuary English**, which distinguish it from RP? Illustrate with examples.
- 2. What is meant by a **rhotic accent**? Mention one **non-rhotic area** in the USA today, and explain why it became non-rhotic in the first place.
- 3. What was **the inkhorn debate** about? Comment on the expansion of vocabulary during the Renaissance in England.
- 4. a) Comment on the current pronunciation of the **initial consonant combination** in the words below. How were these words pronounced before the Early Modern English period?

gnash, knife, gnome, knee

b) Give a brief account of the other main phonological changes in Early Modern English.
